Judge Broderick was appointed United States District Judge for the Southern District of New York on October 4, 1976 and entered on duty November 30, 1976. He assumed senior status on November 30, 1988. He received an A.B. degree from Princeton University in 1941 and an LL.B. degree from Harvard Law School in 1948.

Judge Broderick was engaged in private practice from 1948 to 1954 with the law firm of Hatch, Root, Barrett, Cohen & Knapp. From 1954 until 1956 he served as Deputy Commissioner in charge of legal matters in the New York City Police Department. He was general counsel of the National Association of Investment Companies from 1956 to 1961.

Judge Broderick served as Chief Assistant United States Attorney for the Southern District of New York for the periods 1961 to 1962 and 1962 to 1965, and served for a period in 1962 as United States Attorney. He was Police Commissioner of the City of New York from 1965 to 1966. He practiced law in New York, as a member of the law firm of Phillips, Nizer, Benjamin, Krim & Ballon from 1966 to 1971, and as a member of the law firm of Forsyth Decker Murray & Broderick from 1971 until 1976. Judge Broderick served in the U.S. Army amphibian engineers from 1942 until 1946.

Judge Broderick was chairman of the Criminal Law Committee of the Judicial Conference of the United States.
