Judge Wyatt was appointed United States District Judge for the Southern District of New York on September 28, 1962 and entered on duty January 17, 1963. He received an A.B. degree from the University of Alabama in 1927 and an LL.B. degree from Harvard Law School in 1930.

Judge Wyatt practiced law in New York City from 1930 to 1942 and from 1946 to 1962, and was a member of the firm of Sullivan and Cromwell. He was special assistant to the Attorney General for conscientious objector cases from 1953 to 1963. Judge Wyatt served in the United State Army from 1942 to 1946 and was discharged as a colonel. He was a captain in the Judge Advocate General's Corps from 1942 to 1944 and served in the China-Burma-India Theater from 1944 to 1946.

Judge Wyatt was a member of the American Bar Association, New York County Lawyers Association, Association of the Bar of the City of New York, American College of Trial Lawyers, American Judicature Society, Guild of Catholic Lawyers, and the American Society of International Law.
