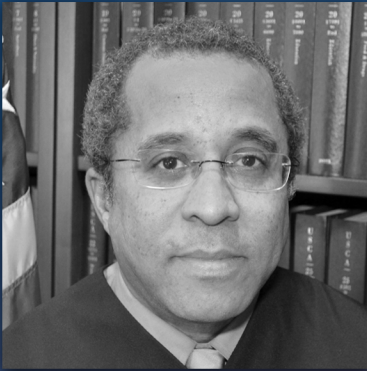

## Vernon S. Broderick

Vernon S. Broderick was nominated to the Southern District of New York bench on April 15, 2013, and confirmed on September 9, 2013. Judge Broderick graduated from Yale University in 1985 and received his J.D. from Harvard Law School in 1988.

Between 1988 and 1993, Judge Broderick was an associate at Weil, Gotshal & Manges, LLP. From 1994 until 2002, he served as an Assistant United States Attorney in the Southern District of New York, during which time he twice received the Justice Department's Director's Award for Superior Performance, and was Chief of the Violent Gangs Unit from 1999 until 2002.

Judge Broderick rejoined Weil, Gotshal as Counsel in July of 2002, and became a partner in January of 2005. His practice focused on white collar criminal cases, regulatory investigations and business litigation. In 2003, he was appointed to the Commission to Combat Police Corruption by Mayor Michael Bloomberg. In 2011, Judge Broderick was appointed to the New York State Commission on Public Integrity by Governor Andrew Cuomo. Judge Broderick has also served on the Boards of numerous not-for-profit organizations, including The Justice Resource Center, LatinoJustice PRLDEF, the Fund for Modern Courts, and the City Bar Justice Center.
